RE: Monthly Report for August 2007

Dear Mayor Boughton and Members of the Common Council:

I am pleased to present to you the Public Works Department report for the month of August.

August 2nd was a great day for the City of Danbury with the groundbreaking for the Roberts Avenue Replacement School. Everyone was pleased to see some of the students and staff carrying their banners and showing their excitement for the project. Their presence reminded each of the Public Works Department staff exactly what this project is really all about.

The Public Works Department continues to move forward on several projects. The Sand and Salt Dome is moving closer to completion. This is a welcome and necessary addition to the Public Works Complex. The Kaplanis Memorial Field building has progressed at a rapid pace. I encourage everyone to drive past the field and observe what a beautiful addition it is to the City's facilities. The Charles Bardo Parking Garage is also nearing completion, and the dedication of the West Side Fire Station Engine 26 will take place in September.

I am very pleased to see the immediate benefits of the formation of the Construction Services Division. The City residents and various facility tenants are experiencing a reduced cost of work to new public building improvements and ADA compliance. As a Public Works Department, we may want to invest more resources in this division.

The Highway Division continues to install drainage throughout the City and for our paving program. All roads on the paving list are expected to be completed by the end of October. The

Highway Division is also gearing up for the drainage work and improvements at the fields at Rogers Park.

The Public Works Department is also working on remediating problems that have been brought forward by Common Council members that are important to their constituents.

A critical piece of equipment has been added to the Public Works Department inventory. The new litter vacuum has proven to be very instrumental in the department's comprehensive program to rid the sidewalks and gutters of litter and cigarette debris. This machine requires one person for operation and frees up some of our valuable manpower to focus on other tasks.

Construction Services report submitted by Tom Hughes, Superintendent of Construction Services:

Danbury High School ADA – The Construction Services Division met with Savin Engineers to review the draft ADA Compliance report they were contracted to produce for DHS. We have completed the first phase of the exterior compliance. Working through our City Bid list and using our own workforce, the following deficiencies cited in the report have been corrected:

- Installed the new handicap drop-off area including construction of a new ADA compliant access ramp at DHS main entry.
- Corrected the handicap drop-off area cited at the lower level adjacent to the stadium.
- Repaired the ADA access to the E building entryway.
- Installed a crosswalk from Building A to Building E.

A new ADA handicap access pathway from the stadium to the athletic fields has been laid out. The path will start on the easterly side of the stadium, ending adjacent to the women's softball field. This requires cutting in a new gate and paved path. Working with our City surveyors, we laid out the path and ensured its compliance. In addition, we have implemented a plan to make our tennis courts ADA compliant which involves cutting a series of gates into the existing fence, allowing handicap access. We will also be installing new railings along the existing ADA ramp from Building D to the stadium. This work is expected to be complete in early October at approximately 50% of the projected cost, using our own workforce and contractors from our City Bid list.

Kaplanis Memorial Field – The opening ceremony will be held October 13, 2007. The bronze plaque featuring a bust of Steve Kaplanis has been ordered and is scheduled to be installed in September. The mechanical rough-ins are complete, the commercial kitchen equipment has been ordered and the interior finish is underway. The Public Buildings Division performed all of the electrical work, resulting in a project savings. The bleachers, scoreboard and public address system have also been ordered and will be installed in September. This project appears to be on schedule, with completion expected in late September or early October.

Local Bridges – The Rose Hill Avenue Bridge repair project was rebid and the bids will be opened in early September. Three utility meetings have been held for the Backus Avenue,

Padanaram Road over East Lake Brook and Padanaram Road over Margerie Brook Bridges. Working with the Engineering Division, the final plans have been approved. The City Engineer would like to bid these projects this fall. Also in conjunction with Engineering, we have inspected several bridges and continue to monitor the bridges listed to be replaced in the near future.

Sand & Salt Shed – The dome is complete and the electrical lighting has been installed. We have set the grades for the paving of the interior and exterior of the building and expect the paving to be complete by mid-September.

Williams Street – Construction Services is working with the Engineering Division to install curbing, drainage, sidewalks and re-pave a section of Williams Street from West Wooster to East Pearl Street.

White Street Streetscape – We reviewed the final plans for constructability and made several suggestions to the designer. A utility meeting was held prior to the issuing of the plans for bid and we assisted the City Engineer with the pre-bid walk through.

Engineering report submitted by Farid L. Khouri, P.E., City Engineer:

Assessment Projects: The Nancy Drive/Carolyn Avenue area sanitary sewer assessment project is 95% complete. Paving started and is expected to be done by the end of September. The Old Farm Road sanitary sewer assessment project is completed. The Wood Street/East Pembroke Road sanitary sewer assessment project is 30% complete. The road is closed weekdays between 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m., with no major disruptions to the residents reported.

The Library Place Parking Garage is expected to be complete by this November. The contractor is working on the installation of the exterior brick façade. We are working with the Construction Services Division on this project.

Site work on the Roberts Avenue Replacement School Phase II project has begun. Other contractors are mobilizing on site. Noise from the Geopier operation has been minimum and without complaints from the surrounding neighbors.

Regarding the new Police Department Headquarters project, remediation work is progressing quickly and on schedule. Traffic controls are in place and seems to be very effective.

Our Traffic Division, the traffic engineer and his two technicians, continue to work on the City's traffic signals to better enhance the vehicular movement on our major roads and install new traffic signals. They also perform reviews of land use development projects.

Forestry report submitted by Mark Miller, Foreman of Forestry Department:

The Forestry Department handled many projects in August. The first project was planting a large magnolia tree in the Beaver Street Park for the block party. The second planting project took place at Rogers Park with Bartlett Tree Experts when we planted an American Liberty Elm to celebrate Bartlett's anniversary of 100 years in the tree industry and its office location in Danbury. The Mayor and many other dignitaries were in attendance. At the Charles Ives House, we cut back the parking lot and pruned the trees and plants. We pruned large willow trees in Rogers Park and at the Scott Fanton Museum, and an elm blocking a light at Main & Keeler Streets. The department also worked at King Street, Morris Street and Stadley Rough Schools, pruning and removing overgrown brush on the playgrounds, and pruned Memorial Drive before Rogers Park Middle School opened.

In August we did storm damage tree calls at locations on Birch Road, Forty Acre Mountain Road, Kingswood Road, and Osborne Street. We removed the following trees in August: a sugar maple on East Liberty Street; a hickory on Fillmore Avenue; a butt at Hayestown Avenue School; a dead ash spruce on Mountain Terrace; a dead maple at 41 Stevens Street; a dead ash at Craigmoor Terrace & Deepwood Drive; dead maples on Great Plain Road and Grandville Avenue; a silver maple at 49 Deer Hill Avenue; a Norway maple for the Tarrywile Trail; a dead ash at 62 Barnum Road; 10 trees for a drainage project on Beaver Brook Road; a cherry tree over the roof at Roberts Avenue School; an ash at 70 Old Ridgebury Road; a Norway maple blocking a fire hydrant at 3 Belmont Place; a beech tree at DHS for the installation of a ramp; a sugar maple at 66 Westville Avenue; and two dead maples on East Starrs Plain Road.

Highway report submitted by Duke Hart, Superintendent of Public Services:

During the month of August, the Highway Department focused on road paving and solving drainage problems that are of special concern during the winter months. We installed new drainage on Beaver Brook Road, Birch Road, Briar Ridge Road, Cel Bret Drive, East Starrs Plain Road, Forty Acre Mountain Road, Fox Den Road, Padanaram Road, Pine Mountain Road, and in the lower parking lot at Danbury High School; repairs were made at four other locations. We continued our in-house program of paving damaged aprons and curbs and correcting water ponding problems. The Department also continued to sweep our City streets and police hot spots for litter. Seven new signs were installed throughout the City, and signs were repaired at 10 other locations. Final grading and backfilling at the new Salt & Sand Shed was completed and is ready for paving.

The Highway Department teamed up with the Parks Maintenance and Tree Departments to remove overgrowth and low hanging limbs and place mulch in preparation for the upcoming school year.

Parks Maintenance report submitted by Duke Hart, Superintendent of Public Services:

The Parks Maintenance Department, in the month of August, continued their mowing program for City areas and schools. We paid special attention to the City Center Green and Kennedy Park for the Summer Concert Series and the Farmer's Market so that the areas looked great when the public was present. The department's temporary summer employees were a great help, allowing our permanent staff to focus on other projects. We teamed up with the Highway and Tree Departments to spruce up the schools before the beginning of the new school year. In preparation for the start of the fall soccer leagues and high school sports programs, the Parks Maintenance Department was also very busy getting fields ready for practice and play.

Public Buildings report submitted by Rick Palanzo, Superintendent of Public Buildings:

During the month of August, the Public Buildings staff was engaged in several projects in addition to maintenance and repair of Danbury public buildings and school buildings. The mechanics performed a minor renovation and furniture rearrangement in the Corporation Counsel's office. The electricians and plumbers completed the electrical and plumbing installation at the new Public Works Salt & Sand Shed; the lighting is bright and very energy efficient. The electricians also completed their rough-in at the Kaplanis Field House and began the installation of devices, in addition to the plumbing crew completing their rough-in. The remediation of the underground fuel storage tank and new gasoline fueling station at the Fire Headquarters building at 41 New Street is 95% complete. We are awaiting the installation of the new fuel metering device, which is due in mid-September. The re-carpeting of the Marian Anderson Recital Hall was completed, and the room is once again very attractive. The renovation to the building at #1 Memorial Drive is progressing, with the demolition done, and the new roof at 90% completion.

Attached please find the statistical analysis for repairs and maintenance work that the Public Buildings mechanics engaged in during the month of August; we received 166 new work requests and completed 148 work requests. In reviewing this report, you will find the repair time that was expended in major work categories (current month versus previous month). Also listed is the total number of work order hours completed (current month versus the previous month).

Our division was heavily engaged in electrical repairs of the City's buildings and schools, with a total of 335.50 man-hours dedicated to this service. The second area of concentration was in plumbing repairs, utilizing 147.00 man-hours of labor. Mechanical repairs were the third category, with 123.00 man-hours expended. A total of 252.50 man-hours were spent on special projects.
